

Our Patron Saint

Our College is named after St. Stephen (1st century), one of the first seven ordained Deacons and the first Martyr of Christianity. His biography and an elaborate apologia by him before Jewish council are recorded in the Book of Acts, chapter 7 (Bible). Though by birth a Hellenistic diaspora Jew, he was brought up by his mother as a true Christian. Justifying the meaning of his name (Stephen = Crown) he was truly a 'crown' of the Church. He was a mirror image of Christ in every sense and was a man full offaith, wisdom and of the Holy Spirit. He taught in the Synagogue of the Libertines. He was accused of blasphemy before the Jewish council and was then stoned to death and while dying, he prayed for the pardon of his accusers.

We should be proud of having St. Stephen as our Patron Saint. We should imbibe from him the message of sacrifice, forgiveness and commitment and try to be crowns of the society.


A Word about our Founder

The life of His Grace Mar Thoma Dionysius is a source of inspiration for all of us in the family of Mount Tabor. His Grace was a pioneer in the educational field of Kerala. More than five decades back, His Grace laid the foundation for a Religo-Educational Centre at Pathanapuram at a beautiful hillock which he christened as 'Mount Tabor'.

His Grace was a student of Christ Church College in the Oxford University during 1937-39. Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, former President of India, was one of his best friends there. Inspired by the noble traditions of western culture and civilization, His Grace wanted the Mount Tabor to be the fountain head of progress for the people around.

He was consecrated as Metropolitan of Niranam Diocese of the Malankara Orthodox Church in 1940 and continued in the same ecclesiastical post for 32 years till his demise on 3rd December 1972.





The valuable services rendered by Mount Tabor educational institutions, hospitals and orphanages in different parts of Kerala and Tamil Nadu testify the commitment of His Grace for the cause of education and social welfare in the backward and under developed.

Annals of the College

St. Stephen's College was founded in 1964 after the name of St. Stephen, the first martyr of Christianity. The college was the fulfillment of a long cherished desire of its founder, His Grace Mar Thoma Dionysius. A number of educational institutions testify the deep devotion of the founder to the cause of higher education in and around Kerala and Tamil Nadu.

The college was formally declared open by His Holiness Mar Baselios Augen I Catholicos of the East on 8 June 1964. Prof T.C. Joseph, Professor of Botany, Union Christian College, Alwaye, was appointed as the Principal and the Junior College started functioning at Mount Tabor premises, Pathanapuram. He was succeeded by Very Rev. Dr. N.J. Thomas Remban. In 1968 the college was shifted to its present site, in the serene village of Maloor, 6 kms away from Pathanapuram.

The college was upgraded in 1978 and now offers Degree courses in Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Economics, Commerce and English. With the introduction of M.Sc. Course in Zoology in1995, it was upgraded as a Post-Graduate college. M.Sc. Course in Chemistry was sanctioned in 1999, M.Sc. Physics was sanctioned in 2001 and M.Sc. Mathematics was sanctioned in 2013. Department of Zoology has been recognized as a Research Centre by the University of Kerala in 2000. Students can do research leading to Ph.D here. The college was accredited at the B++ grade by the NAAC Peer Team which visited the institution in 2004.

It is a matter of pride for the college that three of its faculty members have been elevated to the divine service of the church. The erstwhile Catholicose of the East, Late H.H. Moran Mar Baselios Marthoma Didymus I and the former Metropolitan of Delhi Diocese, Late His Grace Job Mar Philoxenos were serving the college as Heads of the Department of English and His Grace Dr. Joseph Mar Dionysius Metropolitan of Kolkatta Diocese was





serving the college as Reader and Director of Zoology Research Centre when they were called upon for ordination.

The illustrious service rendered by the late Very Rev. Aprem Remban (Rev. Fr Oommen P. Abraham) as Head of the Department of Botany, Local Manager and Principal of our college for a period of over two decades is gratefully acknowledged. The services of Prof. Lukose P. Mathai and Dr. Baby K. Paul as Principals of the college are also acknowledged. Rev. Fr. K.V. Paul too served the college for over a decade as Head of the Department of Syriac, Local Manager and Principal. During his tenure the college was accredited at the B++ level by NAAC. Dr. SoosyKuryan served as Principal of the college from 2011 to 2014.

Dr. Varughese P. Daniel assumed charge as Principal in the year 2014. The college celebrated its Golden Jubilee in 2014. The college was re-accredited by the NAAC Peer team at B Grade with CGPA 2.80 in 2015.Dr. Achamma George took over as the Principal of our college in 2017. The year 2017-18 saw our college becoming more eco conscious. A rain water harvesting unit was installed in the college premises as part of the same.

Dr. K.P Laladhas assumed charge as Principal of the college in the year 2019. The College library has been upgraded as digital library with the inauguration of Very. Rev. M.C Mathews Ramban Memorial digital lab. College now provides 24 hours wifi internet facility. Computerised lab facilities were inducted to Department of Mathematics and Physics. Research Labs were added to departments of Botany, Chemistry and Physics. We have one more Post Graduate course, sanctioned by the Government in the department of Botany with specialisation in Ethnobotany and Ethnopharmacology. A new Examination block has also been added. The college is progressing up with a new academic block, fund initiated by RUSA and also received infrastructure fund from DST-FIST. College is participating in NIRF Ranking and also in DBT-STAR College facility.



Duration of UG Course

The duration of UG Programme shall be three years consisting of six semesters. No student shall be allowed to complete the Programme by attending more than 12 continuous semesters. The duration of each semester shall be five months inclusive of the days of the examinations. There shall be at least 90 working days and a minimum of 450 hours of instruction in a semester.

Attendance:

Students who secure a minimum of 75% attendance in the aggregate for all the Courses of a semester taken together alone





will be allowed to register for End Semester Evaluation. (E.S.E). Others have to repeat thesemester along with the next batch, unless they could make up the shortage of attendance through condonation.

However, the award of Grade for attendance in CE shall be made course wise for practicals only. Condonation of shortage of attendance to a maximum of 10days in a semester subject to a maximum of two times during the whole period of a Degree Programme shall be granted by the University on valid grounds. This condonation shall not be considered for awarding marks for CE in practicals. Benefits of attendance for a maximum of 10 days in a semester shall be granted to students who participate/ attend University Union activities, meetings of the University Bodies and Extra Curricular Activities, on participation / attendance certificate by the production of University Authorities/Principals as the cases may be. But in such cases, condonation will be considered for award of marks for CE in practicals only.

Teachers should actively participate in all academic Programmes. At least two meetings of teachers must be held in every Department of the Institutions in each semester to discuss the matters regarding syllabi, text books etc. The feedback from the students shall also be collected. The Head of the Department should compile all the suggestions/ recommendations and forward the same to the Principal in writing for onward transmission to the University. This should be communicated to the Boards of Studies by the University. All Boards of Studies are to be requested to restructure the syllabi of the First Degree Programmes in tune with the current trends.

For laboratory sessions:

The size of a batch shall depend upon the size of the laboratory, thefacilities available for controlling and supervising the group of students and the availability of the number of instruments for individual use.



The optimal number of students in a batch for a normal laboratory session under the supervision of a teacher will be 16. In Computer laboratory and Language laboratory, the number can be more, or less, depending upon the availability of infrastructure.

There shall be at least one teacher to supervise a batch of not more than 16 students in each laboratory session. For tutorials, a group shallnot generally be more than 15 students. For supervision of Dissertation/ Project, each student shall be assigned to a teacher. Not more than 15 students shall be assigned to a particular teacher in a semester for such supervisory work.

Open course:


There shall be a minimum of 15 students but not more than 75 students for Open Courses. Maximum number of students for Language Course shall not be more than 50.

Continuous Evaluation (CE) & End Semester Evaluation (ESE)

The Evaluation of each Course shall consist of two parts 1) Continuous Evaluation (CE) 2) End Semester Evaluation(ESE) The CE and ESE ratio shall be 1:4 for both Courses with or without practical. There shall be a maximum of 80 marks for ESE and maximum of 20 marks for CE. For all Courses (Theory and Practical), Grades are given on a 7-point scale based on the total percentage of marks (CE+ESE)

For successful completion of a semester, a student shall have a score of minimum SGPA of 4.00 (E Grade)

Assignments or Seminars:

Each student shall be required to do one assignment or one seminar for each Course. Valued assignments shall be returned to the students. The seminars shall be organized by the teacher/ teachers in charge of CE and the same shall be assessed by a group of teachers including the teacher/ teachers in charge of that Course. Assignments/Seminars shall be evaluated on the basis of their quality. The teacher shall define the expected quality of an assignment in terms of structure, content, presentation etc. and inform the same to the students. Due weightage shall be given to the punctuality in submission.

Seminar shall be similarly evaluated in terms of structure, content, presentation, interaction etc.

For each Course there shall be one class test during a semester. Valued answer scripts shall be made available to the students for perusal within 10 working days from the date of the test.

Announcement of results of CE:

The results of the CE shall be displayed within 5 working days from the last day of a semester. Complaints regarding the award of marks for CE if any, have to be submitted to the Head of the Department within 3 working days from the display of results of CE. These complaints shall be examined by the Department Committee and shall arrive at a decision, which shall be communicated to the student. The statement of marks of the CE of all the students shall be approved by the Department Committee, countersigned by the Principal and forwarded to the Controller of Examinations



within 15 working days from the last day of the semester. The University has the right to normalize the CE, if required, for which separate rules shall be framed.

All records of Continuous Evaluation shall be kept in the Department and shall be made available for verification by the University, if andwhen necessary. End Semester Evaluation (ESE): End Semester Evaluation of all the Courses in all the semesters shall be conducted by the University. The results of the ESE shall be arranged to be published according to the Examination Calendar prescribed by the University Level Monitoring Committee (ULMC), which shall not exceed 45 days from the last day of the examination.

Project/Dissertation Work:

For each First Degree Programme there shall be a Project/ Dissertation Work. The Project/Dissertation work can be done either individually or by a group not exceeding five students. However, Viva-Voce based on the Project/Dissertation work shall be conducted individually. The topics shall either be allotted by the supervising teacher or be selected by the students in consultation with the supervising teacher. The report of the Project/ Dissertation shall be submitted to the Department in duplicate before the completion of the sixth semester. There shall be no continuous assessment for Dissertation / Project work. A Board of two Examiners appointed by the University shall evaluate the report of the Project/ Dissertation work.

Social Service/Extension Activity:

It is mandatory for a student to participate in any one of the following Social Service/Extension Activities for not less than forty hours, during the 3rd and 4th semesters, for successful completion of the Programme.

- 1. NSS
- 2. NCC
- 3. Science Club





- 4. Nature Club/Eco Club
- 5. Literary Club
- 6. Women's Study Unit
- 7. Planning Forum

There shall be a General Co-ordinator to be nominated by the College Council, for conducting all these activities. A statement testifying the participation of the students shall be forwarded to the Controller of Examinations along with the statement of CE results of the 4th semester. Those who have not secured the minimum number of hours of Social Service/Extension Activity during the 3rd and 4th semester shall secure the 19 minimum required attendance by attending such Programmes during the 5th semester. In such cases, the details about participation shall be forwarded to the Controller of Examinations, by the College authorities along with the Continuous Evaluation (CE) results of the 5th semester.

Grading System:

Both CE and ESE will be carried out using Indirect Grading system on a 7- point scale.


Consolidation of Grades:

The maximum mark for a Course (ESE Theory) is 80. The duration of ESE is 3 hours. The marks of CE shall be consolidated by adding the marks of Assignment/ Seminar and Test paper respectively for a particular Course. Attendance marks for practicals are awarded

Total marks for the ESE of Practical is 80. The components of ESE of Practical have to be set by the Chairmen, Boards of Study, concerned. The marks for the components of Practical for Continuous Evaluation shall be as shown below.

The marks of a Course are consolidated by combining the marks of ESE and CE (80+20). A minimum of 35% marks (E Grade) shall be required for passing a course with a separate minimum of 35% (E Grade) for End Semester Evaluation (ESE). Those who fail to secure a pass minimum of 35% (E Grade) for a course will have one chance to improve CE marks for the course.

Promotion to Higher Semesters:

Students who complete the semester by securing the minimum required attendance as specified in clause and who register for the End Semester Evaluation conducted by the University of each Semester alone shall be promoted to the next higher semester.

Repetition of the Semester Courses:

Students who fail to secure the minimum required aggregate attendance during a semester shall be given one chance to repeat the semester along with the subsequent batch of students after obtaining re admission, subject to provision, and they will have to repeat the CE for all Courses.





Re-appearance of Failed Students:

"Students who fail shall have to reappear for the ESE of the same along with the next regular batch of students." Candidates who fail to score 'E' grade in the ESE in any of the Course/Courses have to reappear for the ESE of the Course /Courses concerned with next regular batch of students. The number of chances or such appearances is limited to 5 and the same have to be done within a period of 12 continuous semesters including the semester in which they have first appeared. However, students who fail to secure SCPA of 4.00 have to reappear for the ESE with the next regular batch of students for such courses for which they have secured the least Grade for improving the SCPA. Here also the number of appearance is limited to 5 and the same has to be done within a period of 12 continuous semesters including the semester in which they have first appeared. In both cases (i.e. failure to obtain 'E' Grade for individual Course/Courses and 'SCPA of 4.00) students shall not be allowed to repeat the semester, but the marks secured by them for the CE part shall be carried over and added to the marks obtained in the ESE they reappear. However, those who fail in the CE (i.e. those who fail to secure a minimum of 'E' grade) will have one chance to improve the same (except the marks for attendance) along with next regular batch of students.

Grace Marks:

Grace marks shall be awarded for Sports/Arts/ NCC/NSS in recognition of meritorious achievements.

Monitoring of the Programme

Monitoring of the First Degree Programmes shall be done by Committees at three levels viz., Department Level Monitoring Committee (DLMC), College Level Monitoring Committee (CLMC), and University Level Monitoring Committee (ULMC).





Department Level Monitoring Committee (DLMC):

A Committee consisting of the Head of the Department and all teachers of the Department shall monitor the conduct of courses and evaluation under CE. This committee shall examine the complaints, if any, from aggrieved students regarding the evaluation. The Head of the Department shall be the Chairperson and a teacher selected by the DLMC from among the members shall be the Convenor.

College Level Monitoring Committee (CLMC):

The College Level Monitoring Committee shall consist of the Principal, the Heads of the Departments and the elected representatives of teachers in College Council. The Principal shall be the Chairperson and a member selected by the CLMC from among the Heads of the Departments shall be the Convenor. This Committee shall be responsible for the conduct of the First Degree Programmes, ensuring minimum instructional days, making arrangements for ESE (University Examinations) of various semesters etc. This Committee shall consider all the complaints not redressed by the DLMCs. While considering the complaints, by the CLMC, the College Union Chairperson shall be included as an invitee. The College Level Monitoring Committee shall be reconstituted by the Principal immediately on commencement of each academic year.

COLLEGE

The academic year is from June to March and is divided into two semesters. Semester system is followed for all Degree Courses and also for Post-Graduate Courses.

ADMISSION AND WITHDRAWAL

 All candidates seeking admission must acquaint themselves with the rules and regulations of the college and will be bound by them, if admitted.



- - At the time of admission, candidates must produce transfer and conduct certificates in original from the school or college they last attended along with the qualifying certificate and mark list.
 - 3. Candidates from other Universities should produce Migration certificate along with an Eligibility certificate from the University of Kerala.
 - 4. Students who belong to Orthodox community should produce a Community Certificate from their parish priest.
 - 5. Those who seek fee concession must produce Income and Community certificates from the Village Officer.
 - Candidates selected for admission will be required to appear along with their guardian for an interview with the Principal. The selection is provisional and is subjected to confirmation only after the interview and scrutiny of certificates.
 - 7. Candidates will have to pay the first instalment of tuition fees, special fees, caution deposit and such other fees, prescribed by the University before they are allowed to attend classes.
 - 8. Any candidate found to have obtained admission by false representation shall be removed from the roll.
 - 9. A student applying for Transfer Certificate will not be given the certificate unless he/she pays all fees or other dues or such portion thereof as per rules in force.
 - 10. A notice of 24 hours is necessary for the issue of a Transfer Certificate, Conduct Certificate or any other Certificates.
 - 11. If any document is desired to be sent by post from the college office, a self-addressed envelope with sufficient postage stamps should accompany the application.
 - 12. Every student of the college will be issued a Photo Identity Card on enrolment. The student is bound to wear the card while being in the campus.
 - 13. Certificates submitted by the students at the time of admission will be returned only on completion of the course of study.
 - 14. Certificates and mark sheets should be claimed at least within three months after the completion of the course of



study. The college office will not be responsible for the loss or damage of certificates and mark sheets left unclaimed after the above mentioned period.

ATTENDANCE

- Attendance will be taken at the beginning of each period. Late-comers shall not enter the class room without the permission of the concerned teacher.
- 2. Impersonation at roll call will be considered as a serious offence.
- 3. Absence in one period will be treated as absence for half a day.
- 4. Those who abstain from examinations and test papers conducted by the college will be seriously dealt with.
- 5. The certificate of attendance and progress, required for promotion and for admission to the university examination, will not be granted unless:
 - a. The student has at least 75% attendance for the course
 - b. The student has completed the course of instruction to the satisfaction of the authorities of the college.
 - c. His/Her progress in studies and conduct has been satisfactory.
- 4. Continuous absence for 15 days without prior sanction will result in the removal of student from the college roll.

APPLICATION FOR LEAVE

- 1. A student requiring leave for a day/days must apply for the same to the concerned class teacher.
- 2. Application for leave of absence should be in the model given below.
- 3. In the case of absence exceeding five consecutive working days, a medical certificate must be furnished along with the application for leave.
- 4. If a student remains absent without leave for more than seven days he/ she is liable to be removed from the roll.

CODE OF CONDUCT

- Students are expected to be aware of the rules & regulations of the college and abide by them. Ignorance of rules is not an excuse.
- 2. They must conduct themselves with decency and decorum. Any instance of indecent behaviour on the part of boy students towards girl-students or vice versa will be strictly dealt with. They should respect others without their caste, religion or sex. Use of abusive words among students is strictly prohibited. Cases of ragging are evidently criminal and hence liable to severe disciplinary action.
- 3. The Students are expected to be cleanly and respectably dressed. They can wear any formal dress.



- 4. Usage of Identity cards are mandatory for the student community. While on campus, the students should wear their identity cards. No administrative or office services will be provided if identity cards are not produced. Entry into the campus and library will be restricted using identity cards.
- 5. Any action that may disturb the smooth working of the classes must be avoided. Students are strictly forbidden from loitering along the corridors during class hours.
- 6. No student shall leave or enter the classroom without the permission of the teacher.
- 7. Students are expected to keep the college building and premises neat and tidy. Pasting posters or notices, making marks on the walls or furniture are strictly prohibited and shall be liable to punishment. Any damage done to college property will have to be made good, along with appropriate fines.
- 8. Students are forbidden to attend or organize any meeting in the college or to collect money without the permission of the Principal.
- 9. All students are expected to behave themselves in such a way as to maintain the credit and reputation of the college as well as their own.
- 10. The use of tobacco in any form, intoxicating drinks, drugs and sweets is forbidden to all in the campus.
- 11. Possession of lethal weapons inside the college campus will be considered as a serious offence, leading to dismissal from the college.
- 12. Any student suspended from the college shall not enter the college premises during the period of suspension.
- 13. No notice of any kind should be circulated among students without the written permission of the Principal or Students' Affairs Committee Convenor.
- 14. Students are not allowed to bring outsiders to participate in any demonstrations or functions in the campus without prior permission.
- 15. Political activism is strictly banned in the campus vide Judgement of the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala in the WP(C).





- No34118/2016(L) dated 04.11.2016. Students are forbidden to organise or attend meetings other than official ones. Students resorting to strikes are strictly prohibited from entering the campus.
- 16. Students are prohibited from using mobile phones inside the campus. (G.O.RT/No. 346/05/H.Edn. dt. 01.03.2005). Any student using a mobile phone for entertainment purposes will be cautioned and the mobile phone will be confiscated.
- 17. Student celebrations of festivals within the campus and hostels are regulated (Order No. 26483/G1/15/H.Edn. dt. 12.10.2015)
- 18. All students are bound to follow eco-friendliness and eco consciousness in the campus. Students are not allowed to bring vehicles into the campus. They have to park their vehicles at the allotted place at their own risk.
- 19. The Principal or duly constituted College authority may frame and issue disciplinary rules of permanent or temporary nature regulating the conduct of students within the campus or hostel premises from time to time and the students are obliged to obey them.

MINUTES OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE COLLEGE HELD ON 08-05- 2016

The Governing Body of St. Stephen's College, Pathanapuram held on 08-05- 2016 analysed the functioning of the college for the last two years and arrived at the following observations and decisions regarding students' political activities inside the Campus:

St Stephen's College, Pathanapuram, Kollam is a minority educational institution owned by the Society of the Order of Sacred Transfiguration, Mount Tabor, Pathanapuram. The College is situated in a very remote village, Maloor in PathanapuramTaluk. The students who study in this college belong to very poor families. Many of them belong to socially backward castes and groups.

In March 2013, the college witnessed a series of clashes between different student unions which were supported by their parent



political parties. Under such circumstances, the Management of the college was forced to approach the Court and on 04.03.2013, the Hon'ble High court of Kerala issued an interim Order vide No. WP(C) 5522/2013(M) directing the Sub-Inspector of Police, Pathanapuram to afford police protection for the smooth conduct of the college. This interim order was extended three times and the final verdict was on 25.11.2015.

The college had several issues of indiscipline and misconduct during this period of time. The already constituted College Council dealt with every issue and such cases were referred to the Enquiry Committee constituted by the College Council. The Enquiry Committee enquired into such instances and disciplinary actions were taken by the Council based on the enquiry reports. With regard to all these cases, the issues were promptly reported to the Sub-Inspector, Circle Inspector and the Deputy Superintendent of Police.

During the last two academic years the college witnessed quite a few incidents, which disturbed classes and smooth functioning of the college. The management of the college noticed that such types of activities are against the smooth running of the college. The Parents Teachers Association of the college met on 24.02.2015 also recommended total ban of these types of political activities from the college. They also expressed anxiety over the safety of their children.

On the basis of above incidents and facts, the Governing body of the College held on 8-05- 2016 has decided to ban all political activities of students inside the campus to ensure smooth functioning of the college.

The Supreme Court in "University of Kerala Vs. Council of Principals" case reported in 2006 (8) SCC 304, has laid down several guidelines for maintenance of discipline and law and order in the College campus. As per the said guidelines, any instance of acute lawlessness should be reported to the police authorities at the earliest for initiating prompt action.

WORKING DAYS AND CLASS HOURS

The college functions under the full day system with two sessions, morning session of five hours and afternoon session wherein all cocurricular activities of the college is carried out. In the morning, classes begin with a prayer song. When the bell for the prayer rings, all students shall stand up in their place in a prayerful attitude.

The class time is from 8.30 a.m. to 1.30 p.m.

EXAMINATIONS & TEST PAPERS

- 1. There will be two end semesters examinations in an academic year in addition to regular internal examinations and assignments.
- The marks of the examinations are taken into account for internal assessment.
- 3. A progress report will be sent to the guardian after each of the internal examinations.
- 4. Guardians are requested to meet the class teacher on receipt of the report.
- 5. Absence from examinations and test papers shall render the student concerned liable to serious punishments.

PETITIONS & COMPLAINTS

- 1. The students are allowed to submit their complaints to the Principal in person.
- 2. Complaints on behalf of the class may be submitted by the class representative.
- 3. After a personal enquiry, the Principal would take a decision on the complaint which is binding on all concerned.
- 4. However, in cases where a detailed enquiry is required, it is referred to the Students' Affairs Committee.

STUDENTS' AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

1. The committee consists of seven senior members of the teaching staff from various departments.



- - 2. This committee is constituted to maintain discipline both in the class room and in the campus.
 - 3. The committee will look into the grievances of students.
 - 4. Any problem relating to students should be brought to the notice of the Students' Affairs Committee through the class representatives.
 - 5. All students shall co-operate with the committee in its functioning.

ENQUIRY COMMITTEE

- 1. The committee consists of three senior members of the teaching staff nominated by the staff council and one of them is a lady. One of the committee members is appointed as the convenor of the committee.
- 2. Any serious misbehavior by any student reported by the members of the staff or other students which require detailed enquiry may be referred to the College Council by the Principal.
- 3. If the College Council, after preliminary enquiry, feels that a detailed enquiry is required, the case will be referred to the Enquiry Committee.
- 4. The committee has the power to summon any student or staff and collect evidence from them.
- 5. After proper enquiry the committee will make necessary recommendations to the Principal.
- 6. The College Council is the final authority to decide upon the nature of punishment.

FEE REGULATIONS

- 1. Fees are to be paid in eight equal installments. Special fees shall be collected along with the first installment.
- The first installment of tuition fee and special fees from students of senior classes shall be collected within a period of seven consecutive working days beginning from the date of opening of the college.
- 3. If any student fails to pay the fees on due date he/she shall



- be liable to pay a fine of Rs. 5/- along with fees on or before the 10th day after the due date. If the 10th day happens to be a holiday, the next working day will be counted as the 10th day.
- 4. If the fee with the fine of Rs. 5/- is not paid on or before the last day fixed for it, an additional fine of Rs. 10/- will have to be paid. If the same is not paid before the last opportunity, the name of the student will be removed from the rolls of the college with effect from the date following the expiryof that period and the student will not get the benefit of attendance. If the student is to be re-admitted he/she has to apply for the special permission from the Principal and also remit all the dues. The re- admitted students will get the benefit of attendance only from the date of re-admission.
- 5. The last opportunity for the payment of an installment of fee will be the last day previous to the due date of the succeeding installment. But in the case of the due for February, the last opportunity is fixed on 5th of March. If March 5th happens to be a holiday, then the last working day previous to such date will be considered as the last opportunity.
- 6. Fees will be collected at the college office counter from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. on all working days.
- 7. Students from other universities must pay a recognition fee of Rs.300/-
- 8. Students are advised to keep all fee receipts for future reference and for getting refund of caution deposit.

FEE CONCESSION

- 1. Students eligible for fee concession should submit their application to the Principal in the prescribed form within 15 days of their admission.
- 2. Applicants belonging to SC, ST, Kudumbi or OBC and Christian converts, should produce caste and income certificates from the Tahsildar concerned. Such certificates should be produced at the beginning of every subsequent academic year, if the concession is to be renewed.
- 3. Concession will also be available to other students as per the provisions of the Kumara Pillai Commission Report.





CAUTION DEPOSIT RULES

- 1. Every Student on admission to a course of study shall pay the prescribed caution deposit along with the first installment of the fees.
- The caution deposit will be refunded on completion of the course of study after adjusting dues, if any. However, the caution deposit will be refunded before the completion of the course of study, in case the student leaves the college with Transfer Certificate.
- 3. It shall be the responsibility of the student to claim the refund in the prescribed form on the date notified on the notice board.
- 4. The receipt issued for the remittance of caution deposit should be produced along with the application for refund. Failure to produce the original receipt will result in forfeiture of the claim for refund.
- 5. Claim for refund of caution deposit should be made before the re-opening of the college after the completion of the course. The class number of students who did not claim the refund will be published in the college notice board. Amounts unclaimed after two months (April 1 to May 31) from the date of such publication will be forfeited.

ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES

- A student, past or present applying for certificates of transfer, age, character, marks, sports, NCC, shall do so in the prescribed form to the Principal stating the year of study, Admission No., Class last attended and Home Address.
- 2. Ordinarily a notice of 24 hours is necessary for the issue of certificates.
- 3. Transfer Certificate will be issued only after payment of all dues to the college.
- 4. No certificate will be sent by post unless the transmission charges are paid in advance.





INFRASTRUCTURE & FACILITIES

CENTRAL LIBRARY AND INFORMATION SYSTEM

The total carpet area of the Central Library is 300 square metre. This consists of reading space, 100 reading seats, stack section, reference section, journal section and separate digital library.

The total number of books and reference books available is 27933 Journals - 26, Magazines - 37 and Newspapers - 5.

The following electronic resources are available in the library: E-Books (435000), E-Journals (6237), Open Access Journal and Repositories. The library has a Blog and a Website. It also provides unlimited internet access.

The College Library has been upgraded as digital library on 5th August 2020 with the inauguration of Very.Rev.M.C Mathews Ramban Memorial Digital Lab.

Rules of the Library

- 1. All students of the college are members of the Library.
- 2. The central library and information system will function on all working days from 9.00 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. Students are expected to make the best use of it.
- 3. Silence shall be observed in the Library and Reading Room.
- 4. Each under-graduate student will be given two borrower's cards and post-graduate student will be given five borrower's card and books will be issued against their borrower's card only.
- 5. Books borrowed from the Library can be kept for a maximum period of 14 days at a time, they can renew for two times.
- 6. Students can make avail of e-books and e-journals provided by the library via. computer / laptop or mobile phone.
- 7. The students should return the books on the due date itself, otherwise they should pay a fine of Rs. 1/- for each day. No





- fine will be charged for holidays.
- 8. A student who returns the book should get back the borrower's card.
- 9. Borrowers will be held responsible for any damage caused to a book. If a book is damaged or lost, he/she will have to replace it or pay the cost of the book at the current rates.
- 10. Members are not allowed to sub-lend the books of the library
- 11. Members of the Library are forbidden from making markings in the books or periodicals.
- 12. The borrowers cards issued to the students should be returned at the end of the course.
- 13. In the case of necessity, the Librarian has the right to recall a book from any member at any time.
- 14. Any matter not covered by the rules given above shall be decided by the Principal who reserves the right to amend or add to these rules.
- 15. Besides the Central Library, department libraries are also functioning. Students can borrow books from the department libraries also.

UGC INFLIBNET-NLIST FACILITIES

All students and faculty of the college can access the INFLIBNET facilities for e-journal and e-books. The access to these e-resources is via username and password. Written request for user accounts should be given to the Librarian.

SEMINAR HALL

The college has a Seminar/Conference Hall with all modern audio visual and IT facility.

AUDITORIUM

The college is proud to have a spacious, well-equipped and ideally located Auditorium which can house an audience of up to 1000. The auditorium hosts programmes of academic importance as well as cultural significance in addition to competitions,

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR CANDIDATES CONTESTING IN THE COLLEGE UNION ELECTION

(EXTRACTS FROM THE LYNGDOH COMMITTEE REPORT AS ACCEPTED BY THE HON'BLE SUPREME COURT OF INDIA)

- Under Graduate students between the ages of 17 and 22 may contest elections. The age range may be appropriately relaxed in the case of professional colleges, where course often range between 4 to 5 years.
- 2. For Post Graduate students the maximum age limit to legitimately contest an election would be 24-25 years.
- 3. For Research students the maximum age limit to legitimately contest an election would be 28 years.
- 4. Although, the committee would refrain from prescribing any particular minimum marks to be attained by the candidate, the candidate should in no event have any academic arrears in the year of contesting the election.
- 5. The candidate should have attained the minimum percentage of attendance as prescribed by the University or 75% attendance, which ever is higher.
- 6. The candidates shall have one opportunity to contest for the post of office bearer and two opportunities to contest for the post of an executive member.
- 7. The candidate shall not have a previous criminal record, that is to say he should not have been tried and / or convicted of any criminal offence or misdemeanor. The candidate shall also not have been subjected to any disciplinary action by the University authorities.
- 8. The candidate must be a regular, full-time student of the



college/ University and should not be a distance/proximate education student. This is to say that all eligible candidates must be enrolled in a full time course, the course duration being one year.

- 5. No student from other classes will be permitted to join a class going on tour.
- 6. There should be atleast two teachers (one male and one female) accompanying the team.

ASSOCIATIONS

Associations of various departments comprising of staff & students work actively to involve students in co-curricular activities. One of the staff members of the department is nominated as incharge and other office bearers are selected from among the students. The associations organize seminars, lectures, debates, competitions etc.





NATIONAL CADET CORPS (N.C.C.)

The N.C.C. aims at inculcating in students a spirit of discipline and a willingness to serve the country. Boys & girls can get themselves admitted to the N.C.C. in the beginning of each academic year. The cadets are given regular training in the college and at camps. Examinations are held and merit certificates are awarded. As per the Order No. Ac. AV/1/Grace marks dated 25.02.2015 of the University of Kerala, eligible NCC cadets will be awarded grace marks on the basis of the Gross Total Marks for Degree Course. Seats are also reserved for the N.C.C. cadets who complete the course meritoriously and they are eligible for getting admission in the reserved seats of Medicine, Engineering and Polytechnic courses. Uniforms and refreshment are supplied free of cost. At present our college has one unit with the strength of 108 cadets consisting of both boys and girls, who are trained by 14 (K) Bn., Pathanamthitta.

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
