Our Patron Saint

Our college is named after St. Stephen, the first of the ordained Deacons and the first Martyr of Christianity. His biography and an elaborate apologia by him before Jewish council are recorded in The Book of Acts in the Bible. Justifying the meaning of his name the crown he was truly a ‘crown’ of the Church. He was a mirror image of Christ in every sense and was a man of faith, wisdom and of the Holy Spirit. A great orator and a fearless advocate of his faith, St. Stephen was accused of blasphemy by the Jewish Synod and was condemned to death by stoning. Even in the face of a painful death, St. Stephen stayed true to his core beliefs and prayed according to the Bible for his persecutors. The College strives to imbibe the qualities of courage, conviction and sacrifice from St. Stephen and impart it to her students and to transform them to shine as crowns of the society.



Our Founder

The life of His Grace Mar Thoma Dionysius of Blessed Memory is a source of inspiration for all of us in the family of Mount Tabor. His Grace was a pioneer in the educational field of Kerala. Half a century ago, His Grace laid the foundation for a Religio-Educational Centre at the beautiful hillock of Pathanapuram which he christened as “Mount Tabor. His Grace was a student of Christ Church College, Oxford University during 1937-39. Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, former President of India, was one of his best friends there. Inspired by the noble educational traditions of western culture, His Grace wanted Mount Tabor to be the fountainhead of progress for the people around.

He was consecrated as Metropolitan in the year 1940 and continued in this ecclesiastical post for 32 years till his demise on 3rd December 1972. Besides being an episcopal leader, he was a philanthropist, humanist and a visionary educationist.

The valuable services rendered by Mount Tabor educational institutions, hospitals and orphanages testify his commitment for the cause of education and social welfare in the backward and underdeveloped areas of Kerala and Tamil Nadu.

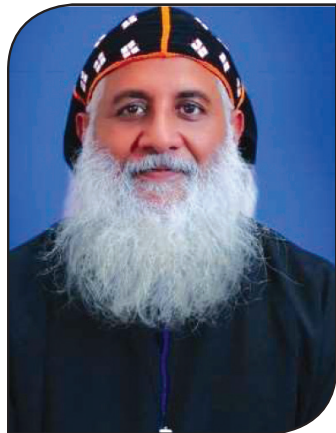

ANNALS OF THE COLLEGE

- 1964 : The college was formally declared open by H. H. Moran Mor Baselios Augen I Catholicos of the East on 8 June 1964. Prof T. C. Joseph, Professor of Botany, Union Christian College, Alwaye, was appointed as the Principal of the Junior College affiliated to the University of Kerala which started functioning at Mount Tabor premises, Pathanapuram.
- 1968 : The college was shifted to its present site, in the serene village of Maloor, 6 kms away from Pathanapuram.
- 1970 : New academic building was established and consecrated by H.H. Moran Mor Baselios Augen I.
- 1978 : The college was upgraded as a degree college and started offering Undergraduate course in Zoology.
- 1979-83: Introduction of UG courses in Physics, Mathematics, Economics, Chemistry and Botany.
- 1989 : The college celebrated its Silver Jubilee.
- 1995 : With the introduction of M.Sc. Course in Zoology, the college was upgraded as a Post-Graduate college.
- 1997 : Inaugurated the H.H. Didymos auditorium.
- 1998 : Introduction of UG course under the Department of Commerce.
- 1999 : M.Sc. Chemistry was sanctioned.
- 2000 : Department of Zoology has been recognized as a Research Centre by the University of Kerala.
- 2001 : M.Sc. Physics was sanctioned.
- 2004 : The college was accredited at the B++ grade by the NAAC.
- 2013 : M.Sc. Mathematics was sanctioned.
- 2014 : Department of English started its UG Course.
- 2014 : The college celebrated its Golden Jubilee. Hon. Chief Minister of Kerala Shri. Oommen Chandy was the Chief guest.
- 2015 : The college was re-accredited by NAAC at B Grade with CGPA 2.80.
- 2020 : M.Sc. Botany was sanctioned.
- 2022 : Chemistry department was upgraded as a Research Department. College was re-accredited by NAAC at B++ grade with an improved CGPA of 2.91.
- 2024 : Botany Department upgraded to research department
- 2024 : College celebrated its Diamond Jubilee

CBCSS (2020 Admission onwards)

Duration of UG Programme

The duration of UG Programme shall be three years consisting of six semesters. No student shall be allowed to complete the Programme by attending more than 12 continuous semesters. The duration of each semester shall be five months inclusive of the days of the examinations. There shall be at least 90 working days and a minimum of 450 hours of instruction in a semester.

Attendance

Students who secure a minimum of 75% attendance in the aggregate for all the Courses of a semester taken together alone will be allowed to register for End Semester Evaluation. (E.S.E). Others have to repeat the semester along with the next batch, unless they could make up the shortage of attendance through condonation.

However, the award of Grade for attendance in CE shall be made course wise for practicals only. Condonation of shortage of attendance to a maximum of 10 days in a semester subject to a maximum of two times during the whole period of a Degree Programme shall be granted by the University on valid grounds. This condonation shall not be considered for awarding marks for CE in practicals. Benefits of attendance for a maximum of 10 days in a semester shall be granted to students who participate/attend University Union activities, meetings of the University Bodies and Extra Curricular Activities, on production of participation / attendance certificate by the University Authorities/ Principals as the cases may be. But in such cases, condonation will be considered for award of marks for CE in practicals only.

For laboratory sessions

The size of a batch shall depend upon the size of the laboratory, the facilities available for controlling and supervising the group of students and the availability of the number of instruments for individual use.

The optimal number of students in a batch for a normal laboratory session under the supervision of a teacher will be 16. In Computer laboratory and Language laboratory, the number can be more, or less, depending upon the availability of infrastructure.



Open Course

There shall be a minimum of 15 students but not more than 75 students for Open Courses. Maximum number of students for Language Course shall not be more than 50.

Continuous Evaluation (CE) & End Semester Evaluation (ESE)

The Evaluation of each Course shall consist of two parts

1. Continuous Evaluation (CE)
2. End Semester Evaluation (ESE)

The CE and ESE ratio shall be 1:4 for both Courses with or without practical. There shall be a maximum of 80 marks for ESE and maximum of 20 marks for CE. For all Courses (Theory and Practical), Grades are given on a 7-point scale based on the total percentage of marks (CE+ESE).

A minimum of 35% of marks (E Grade) is required for passing a course with a separate minimum of 35% marks (E grade) for Continuous Evaluation and End Semester Examination.

For successful completion of a semester, a student shall have a score of minimum SGPA of 4.00 (E Grade)

Assignments or Seminars

For each Course there shall be one class test during a semester. Valued answer scripts shall be made available to the students for perusal within 10 working days from the date of the test.

Announcement of results of CE

The results of the CE shall be displayed within 5 working days from the last day of a semester. Complaints regarding the award of marks for CE, if any, have to be submitted to the Head of the Department within 3 working days from the display of results of CE. These complaints shall be examined by the Department Committee



and shall arrive at a decision, which shall be communicated to the student. The statement of marks of the CE of all the students shall be approved by the Department Committee, countersigned by the Principal and forwarded to the Controller of Examinations within 15 working days from the last day of the semester. The University has the right to normalize the CE, if required, for which separate rules shall be framed.

All records of Continuous Evaluation shall be kept in the Department and shall be made available for verification by the University, if and when necessary.

End Semester Evaluation (ESE)

End Semester Evaluation of all the courses in all the semesters shall be conducted by the University. The results of the ESE shall be arranged to be published according to the Examination Calendar prescribed by the University Level Monitoring Committee (ULMC), which shall not exceed 45 days from the last day of the examination.

Project/Dissertation Work

For each First-Degree Programme there shall be a Project/Dissertation Work. The Project/Dissertation work can be done either individually or by a group not exceeding five students. However, Viva-Voce based on the Project/Dissertation work shall be conducted individually.

Grading System

Both CE and ESE will be carried out using the Indirect Grading system on a 7- point scale.

Consolidation of Grade

The maximum mark for a Course (ESE Theory) is 80. The duration of ESE is 3 hours. The marks of CE shall be consolidated by adding the marks of Assignment/ Seminar and Test paper respectively for a particular Course. Attendance marks for practicals are awarded.

Total marks for the ESE of Practical is 80. The components of ESE of Practical have to be set by the Chairmen, Boards of Study, concerned. The marks for the components of Practical for Continuous Evaluation shall be as shown below.

The marks of a Course are consolidated by combining the marks of ESE and CE (80+20). A minimum of 35% marks (E Grade) shall be required for passing a course with a separate minimum of 35% (E Grade) for End Semester Evaluation (ESE). Those who fail to secure a pass minimum of 35% (E Grade) for a course will have one chance to improve CE marks for the course.

Promotion to Higher Semesters

Students who complete the semester by securing the minimum required attendance as specified in clause and who register for the End Semester Evaluation conducted by the University of each Semester alone shall be promoted to the next higher semester.

Repetition of the Semester Courses

Students who fail to secure the minimum required aggregate attendance during a semester shall be given one chance to repeat the semester along with the subsequent batch of students after obtaining readmission, subject to provision, and they will have to repeat the CE for all Course.



Re-appearance of Failed Students

Students who fail shall have to reappear for the ESE of the same along with the next regular batch of students. Candidates who fail to score 'E' grade in the ESE in any of the Course/Courses have to reappear for the ESE of the Course/Courses concerned with the next regular batch of students. The number of chances for such appearances is limited to 5 and the same have to be done within a period of 12 continuous semesters including the semester in which they have first appeared. However, students who fail to secure an SCPA of 4.00 have to reappear for the ESE with the next regular batch of students for such courses for which they have secured the least Grade for improving the SCPA. Here also the number of appearances is limited to 5 and the same has to be done within a period of 12 continuous semesters including the semester in which they have first appeared. In both cases (i.e., failure to obtain 'E' Grade for individual Course/Courses and 'SCPA of 4.00) students shall not be allowed to repeat the semester, but the marks secured by them for the CE part shall be carried over and added to the marks obtained in the ESE they reappear. However, those who fail in the CE (i.e., those who fail to secure a minimum of 'E' grade) will have one chance to improve the same (except the marks for attendance) along with the next regular batch of students.

Admission and Withdrawal

The academic year is from June to March and is divided into two semesters. Semester system is followed for all Under Graduate and Postgraduate Courses.

1. All candidates seeking admission must acquaint themselves with the rules and regulations of the college and will be bound by them, if admitted.
2. At the time of admission, candidates must produce transfer and conduct certificates in original from the school or college they last attended along with the qualifying certificate and marklist.
3. Candidates from other Universities should produce a Migration certificate along with an Eligibility certificate from the University of Kerala.
4. Students who belong to Orthodox community should produce a Community Certificate from their parish priest.
5. Those who seek fee concession must produce Income and Community certificates from the Village Officer.



6. Candidates selected for admission will be required to appear along with their guardian for an interview with the Principal. The selection is provisional and is subjected to confirmation only after the interview and scrutiny of certificates.
7. Candidates will have to pay the first installment of tuition fees, special fees, caution deposit and such other fees, prescribed by the University before they are allowed to attend classes.
8. Any candidate found to have obtained admission by false representation shall be removed from the roll.
9. A student applying for Transfer Certificate will not be given the certificate unless he/she pays all fees or other dues or such portion thereof as per rules in force.
10. A notice of 24 hours is necessary for the issue of a Transfer Certificate, Conduct Certificate or any other Certificates.
11. If any document is desired to be sent by post from the college office, a self-addressed envelope with sufficient postage stamps should accompany the application.
12. Every student of the college will be issued a Photo Identity Card on enrolment. The student is bound to wear the card while being in the campus.
13. Certificates submitted by the students at the time of admission will be returned only on completion of the course of study.
14. Certificates and mark sheets should be claimed at least within three months after the completion of the course of study. The college office will not be responsible for the loss or damage of certificates and mark sheets left unclaimed after the above-mentioned period.

CODE OF CONDUCT

1. Students are expected to be aware of the rules & regulations of the college and abide by them. Ignorance of rules is not an excuse.
2. Students should maintain decorum appropriate for an educational institution, refrain from discrimination on the grounds of caste, religion or sex and abstain from indecent behaviour. Use of abusive words among students is strictly prohibited. Ragging is a criminal offense and hence liable to severe legal action.
3. The students are expected to be dressed appropriately.
4. Usage of Identity cards are mandatory for the student, while on campus. Administrative services and other college facilities will not be provided if identity cards are not produced.
5. Any activities that may disturb the smooth functioning of the classes must be avoided.
6. No student shall leave or enter the classroom without the permission of the teacher.
7. Students are expected to keep the college building and premises neat and tidy. Pasting posters or notices, making marks on the walls or furniture are strictly prohibited and shall be liable to punishment. Any damage done to college property will be reimbursed from the student.
8. Students are prohibited from attending or organizing any meeting in the college and from collecting money, without the permission of the Principal.
9. The use of tobacco (in any form), alcohol and illegal drugs/intoxicants are strictly prohibited.
10. Possession of lethal weapons inside the college is strictly prohibited and may lead to dismissal.
11. Any student suspended from the college shall not enter the college premises during the period of suspension.



12. No notice of any kind should be circulated among students without the written permission of the Principal or Students Affairs Committee Convenor.
13. Students are not allowed to bring outsiders to participate in any demonstrations or functions in the campus without prior permission.
14. Political activism is strictly banned in the campus vide Judgement of the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala in the WP(C). No34118/2016(L) dated 04.11.2016. Students are forbidden to organise or attend meetings other than official ones. Students resorting to strikes are strictly prohibited from entering the campus.
15. Students are prohibited from using mobile phones inside the campus, (G.O.RT/No. 346/05/H. Edn. dt. 01.03.2005). Any student using a mobile phone for entertainment purposes will be cautioned and the mobile phone will be confiscated.
16. Student celebrations of festivals within the campus and hostels are regulated (Order No. 26483/G1/15/H. Edn. dt. 12.10.2015)
17. All students are bound to follow eco-friendliness and eco-consciousness in the campus.
18. Students are prohibited from bringing single use plastic in to the campus.
19. Students are obliged to comply with any other rules and regulations that may be issued by the Principal or a duly constituted college authority.

MINUTES OF THE COLLEGE GOVERNING BODY MEETING HELD ON 08/05/2016

The Governing Body of St. Stephen's College, Pathanapuram held on 08-05-2016 analysed the functioning of the college for the last two years and arrived at the following observations and decisions regarding students' political activities inside the Campus.



St Stephen's College, Pathanapuram, Kollam is a minority educational institution owned by the Society of the Order of Sacred Transfiguration, Mount Tabor, Pathanapuram. The College is situated in a very remote village, Maloor in Pathanapuram Taluk. The students who study in this college belong to very poor families. Many of them belong to socially backward castes and groups.

In March 2013, the college witnessed a series of clashes. between different student unions which were supported by their parent political parties. Under such circumstances, the Management of the college was forced to approach the Court and on 04.03.2013, the Hon'ble High court of Kerala issued an interim Order vide No. WP(C) 5522/2013(M) directing the Sub-Inspector of Police, Pathanapuram to afford police protection for the smooth conduct of the college. This interim order was extended three times and the final verdict was on 25.11.2015.

The college had several issues of indiscipline and misconduct during this period of time. The already constituted College Council dealt with every issue and such cases were referred to the Enquiry Committee constituted by the College Council. The Enquiry Committee enquired into such instances and disciplinary actions were taken by the Council based on the enquiry reports. With regard to all these cases, the issues were promptly reported to the Sub-Inspector, Circle Inspector and the Deputy Superintendent of Police. During the last two academic years the college witnessed quite a few incidents, which disturbed classes and smooth functioning of the college. The management of the college noticed that such types of activities are against the smooth running of the college. The Parents Teachers Association of the college met on 24.02.2015 also recommended total ban of these types of political activities from the college. They also expressed anxiety over the safety of their children.

On the basis of above incidents and facts, the Governing body of the College held on 8-05- 2016 has decided to ban all political activities of students inside the campus to ensure smooth functioning of the college.

The Supreme Court in "University of Kerala Vs. Council of Principals case reported in 2006 (8) SCC 304, has laid down several guidelines for maintenance of discipline and law and order in the College



campus. As per the said guidelines, any instance of acute lawlessness should be reported to the police authorities at the earliest for initiating prompt action.

WORKING DAYS AND CLASS HOURS

The college functions under the full day system with two sessions, morning session of three hours and afternoon session of two hours wherein all cocurricular activities of the college is carried out. In the morning, classes begin with a prayer song. When the bell for the prayer rings, all students shall stand up in their place in a prayerful attitude. The class time is from 9.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m.

EXAMINATIONS AND TEST PAPERS

1. There will be two end semester examinations in an academic year in addition to regular internal examinations and assignments.
2. The marks of the examinations are taken into account for internal assessment.
3. A progress report will be sent to the guardian after each of the internal examinations.
4. Guardians are requested to meet the class teacher on receipt of the report.
5. Absence from examinations and test papers shall render the student concerned liable to serious punishments.

PETITIONS AND COMPLAINTS

1. The students are allowed to submit their complaints to the Principal in person.
2. Complaints on behalf of the class may be submitted by the class representative.
3. After a personal enquiry, the Principal would take a decision on the complaint which is binding on all concerned.
4. However, in cases where a detailed enquiry is required, it is referred to the Students' Affairs Committee.



STUDENTS' AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

1. The committee consists of seven senior members of the teaching staff from various departments.
2. This committee is constituted to maintain discipline both in the classroom and on the campus.
3. The committee will look into the grievances of students.
4. Any problem relating to students should be brought to the notice of the Students' Affairs Committee through the class representatives.
5. All students shall co-operate with the committee in its functioning

ENQUIRY COMMITTEE

1. The committee consists of four senior members of the teaching staff nominated by the staff council and one of them is a lady. One of the committee members is appointed as the convener of the committee.
2. Any serious misbehaviour by any student reported by the members of the staff or other students which require detailed enquiry may be referred to the College Council by the Principal.
3. If the College Council, after preliminary enquiry, feels that a detailed enquiry is required, the case will be referred to the Enquiry Committee.
4. The committee has the power to summon any student or staff and collect evidence from them.
5. After proper enquiry the committee will make necessary recommendations to the Principal.
6. The College Council is the final authority to decide upon the nature of punishment.

FEE CONCESSION

1. Students eligible for fee concession should submit their application to the Principal in the prescribed form within 15 days of their admission.



2. Applicants belonging to SC, ST, Kudumbi or OBC and Christian converts, should produce caste and income certificates at the beginning of every subsequent academic year, if the concession is to be renewed.
3. Concession will also be available to other students as per the provisions of the Kumara Pillai Commission Report.

CAUTION DEPOSIT RULES

1. Every Student on admission to a course of study shall pay the prescribed caution deposit along with the first installment of the fees.
2. The caution deposit will be refunded on completion of the course of study after adjusting dues, if any. However, the caution deposit will be refunded before the completion of the course of study, in case the student leaves the college with a Transfer Certificate
3. It shall be the responsibility of the student to claim the refund in the prescribed form on the date notified on the notice board.
4. The receipt issued for the remittance of caution deposit should be produced along with the application for refund. Failure to produce the original receipt will result in forfeiture of the claim for refund.
5. Claim for refund of caution deposit should be made before the re-opening of the college after the completion of the course. The class number of students who did not claim the refund will be published in the college notice board. Amounts unclaimed after two months (April 1 to May 31) from the date of such publication will be forfeited.

ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES

1. A student, past or present applying for certificates of transfer, age, character, marks, sports, NCC, shall do so in the prescribed form to the Principal stating the year of study, Admission Class last attended and Home Address.
2. Ordinarily a notice of 24 hours is necessary for the issue of certificates.



3. Transfer Certificate will be issued only after payment of all dues to the college.
4. No certificate will be sent by post unless the transmission charges are paid in advance.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND FACILITIES

Central Library and Information System

The Central Library consists of reading space, 100 reading seats, stack section, reference section, journal section and separate digital library.

The total number of books and reference books available is 31,226.

Journals 33, Magazines 8 and Newspapers 5, besides electronic resources consisting of E-Books, E-Journals, Open Access Journals and Repositories. The library has a Blog and a Website. It also provides unlimited internet access. The library catalogue can be accessed through the college website.

The College Library was upgraded as a digital library on 5 August 2020 with the inauguration of Very. Rev. M.C Mathews Remban Memorial Digital Lab.

Rules of the Library

1. All students of the college are members of the library.
2. The central library and information system will function on all working days from 9.00 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. Students are expected to make the best use of it.
3. Silence shall be observed in the Library and Reading Room.
4. Each under-graduate student will be given two borrower's cards and post-graduate students will be given five borrower's cards and books will be issued against their borrower's card only.
5. Books borrowed from the library can be kept for a maximum period of 14 days at a time, they can be renewed for two times.
6. Students can make avail of e-books and e-journals provided by the library.



7. The students should return the books on the due date itself, otherwise they should pay a fine of Rs. 1/- for each day. No fine will be charged for public holidays.
8. A student who returns the book should get back the borrower's card.
9. Borrowers will be held responsible for any damage caused to a book. If a book is damaged or lost, he/she will have to replace it or pay the cost of the book at the current rates.
10. Members are not allowed to sub-lend the books of the library.
11. Members of the Library are forbidden from making markings in the books or periodicals.
12. The borrowers' cards issued to the students should be returned at the end of the course.
13. In the case of necessity, the Librarian has the right to recall a book from any member at any time.
14. Any matter not covered by the rules given above shall be decided by the Principal who reserves the right to amend or add to these rules.
15. Besides the Central Library, department libraries are also functioning. Students can borrow books from the department libraries also.

UGC INFLIBNET-NLIST FACILITIES

All students and faculty of the college can access the INFLIBNET-NLIST facilities for e-journal and e-books. The access to these e-resources is via username and password. Written requests for user accounts should be given to the Librarian.

Counselling Centre

College counselling centre is dedicated to supporting students' mental and emotional well-being. It offers confidential guidance and personalized strategies to help students navigate academic pressures, personal challenges, and life transitions.



Language Lab

The college has a well-equipped language laboratory to assist the students in language learning. It offers an immersive and interactive language learning experience to the students and helps them practice listening, speaking, reading and writing skills in any language.

Seminar Hall

The college has three Seminar/Conference halls with all modern audio visual and IT facilities. The main seminar hall is fully airconditioned and is equipped with smart interactive panel.

Auditorium

The college is proud to have a spacious, well-equipped and ideally located auditorium which can house an audience of up to 1000. The auditorium hosts programmes of academic importance as well as cultural significance in addition to competitions, inaugurations, variety entertainment programmes and festival celebrations.

Canteen

The college canteen functions on the ground floor of the new building. Light refreshment and Lunch are served on all working days.

Very Rev. T. M. Samuel Remban Memorial Sports Hostel

The Kerala Sports Council Sports Hostel for Volleyball players, Very Rev. T. M. Samuel Remban Memorial Sports Hostel, named after Late Very Rev. T. M. Samuel Remban (Member, Mount Tabor Diara) is attached to the college. The hostel can accommodate 21 inmates.

Museum

The St. Stephen's College Zoology Museum continues to be a source of pride for the college, housing a meticulously categorised collection of hundreds of specimens. The elections and activities of the College Union will be governed by the rules and regulations of the University of Kerala.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR CANDIDATES CONTESTING IN THE COLLEGE UNION ELECTION

(Extracts from the Lyngdoh committee report as accepted by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India)

1. Under Graduate students between the ages of 17 and 22 may contest elections. The age range may be appropriately relaxed in the case of professional colleges, where courses often range between 4 to 5 years.
2. For Post Graduate students the maximum age limit to legitimately contest an election would be 24-25 years.
3. For Research students the maximum age limit to legitimately contest an election would be 28 years.
4. Although, the committee would refrain from prescribing any particular minimum marks to be attained by the candidate, the candidate should in no event have any academic arrears in the year of contesting the election.
5. The candidate should have attained the minimum percentage of attendance as prescribed by the University or 75% attendance, whichever ever is higher.
6. The candidates shall have one opportunity to contest for the post of office bearer and two opportunities to contest for the post of an executive member.
7. The candidate shall not have a previous criminal record, that is to



say he should not have been tried and / or convicted of any criminal offence or misdemeanor. The candidate shall also not have been subjected to any disciplinary action by the University authorities.

8. The candidate must be a regular, full-time student of the college/ University and should not be a distance/proximate education student. This is to say that all eligible candidates must be enrolled in a full-time course, the course duration being one year.

CO-CURRICULAR PROGRAMMES

Excursions and Study Tours

1. Students are not permitted to organize or conduct excursions or study tours without the knowledge and consent of the Principal.
2. Study tours will be organized by the departments.
3. Only final year/final semester students will be permitted to go on excursions or study tours.
4. A detailed programme of travel, places of visit, stay, names of the participants etc should be submitted to the Principal before proceeding on a tour.
5. No student from other classes will be permitted to join a class going on tour.
6. There should be at least two teachers (one male and one female) accompanying the team.

Associations

Associations of various departments comprising staff & students work actively to involve students in co-curricular activities. One of the staff members of the department is nominated as in-charge and other office bearers are selected from among the students. The associations organize seminars, lectures, debates, competitions etc

Extension Activities

The college conducts a number of extension activities every year under the leadership of various departments, clubs and committees. The IQAC has introduced an integrated crowd funded aid programme named "Karuthal". The project provides food, financial assistance and educational loans to those students in need. Various other extension activities are conducted by the NSS and NCC units of the college as well.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT & ANTI RAGGING COMMITTEE

Ragging is prohibited by law. It is a non-bailable criminal offense and is punishable with rigorous imprisonment up to seven years. Students shall not indulge in any of the following activities which are treated as ragging.

1. Any activity that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of a student. Exploiting the service of a junior student by a senior student or a group of senior students.
2. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a junior student including fund-raising for organisation.
3. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: annoying, playing practical jokes, sexual abuse, homo sexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene acts or gestures.
4. Any act of abuse by spoken words, e-mail, SMS, or any other means
5. Any word or act that causes hurt to the dignity of the individual
6. Entering without permission to any class other than the one assigned to a student.



7. Forcing a student to boycott class without his/her consent to participate in strike, demonstration dharna etc.

The complaints or information with regard to ragging could be oral or written and even from third parties. The burden/ responsibility of proving his/her innocence rests with the accused. Complaints can be lodged with the Principal, Staff members or any of the members of the Ragging Prevention Committee. All complaints/ information received shall be kept strictly confidential.
